CANS/ANSA Training for Trainers

Description:

This two-day online CANS/ANSA Trainer Training workshop is designed for individuals who wish to provide training as well as coaching on the CANS/ANSA to staff within their own organizations. Participants will be presented a standard TCOM and CANS/ANSA training curricula. Key concepts and skills will be practiced through small group discussions, exercises, and activities. Standard curriculum and other materials used during the workshop will be provided to support their work in helping trainees become certified in the use of the CANS/ANSA. Certified Trainer re-certification requires initial and annual CANS/ANSA certification with a score of .80 or above. Come join our growing team of Alameda County CANS and ANSA Trainers advancing county-wide transformation.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Articulate the context in which the CANS & ANSA are being used in Alameda County.
- 2. Discuss how communimetrics ensures that the CANS & ANSA are person-centered tools.
- 3. Articulate at least 3 core concepts in implementing the Transformational Collaborative Outcome Management (TCOM) approach.
- 4. Describe how TCOM is an outcomes management approach that helps to address key tensions within complex systems.
- 5. Describe how the TCOM framework helps to develop a theory of change.
- 6. Practice integrating CANS/ANSA into service & support plans
- 7. Discuss consensus and disagreement from a TCOM and communimetric frame.
- 8. Identify and put into practice the 6 key principles of a communimetric tool and its application in rating the Alameda County CANS & ANSA items.
- 9. Create training materials that demonstrate understanding of the core concepts.
- 10. Utilize skills from the training process to achieve a .80 on the CANS/ANSA Certification Exam
